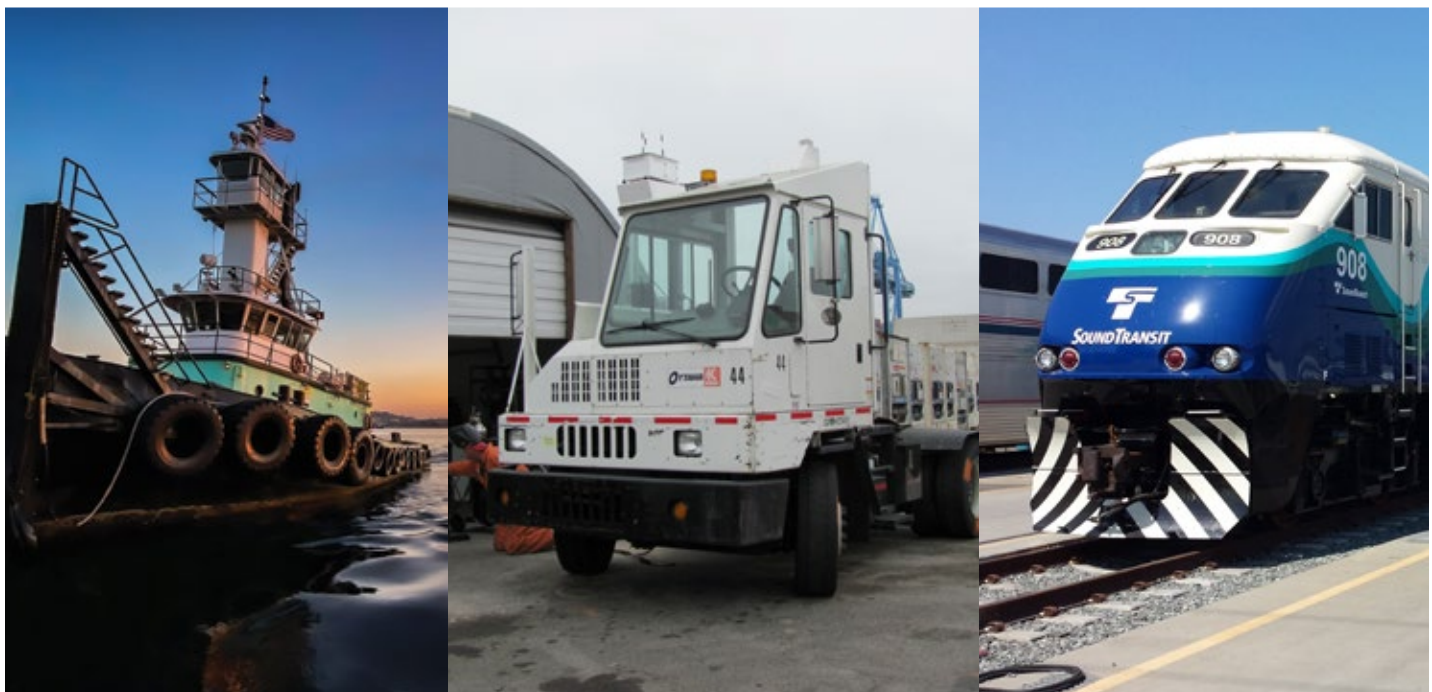


# Do you own or operate diesel equipment?

Or do you know of a business in your community that does?



There may be an opportunity for grant funding to reduce diesel pollution in your area.

The Puget Sound Clean Air Agency's Diesel Program is looking for project ideas to reduce diesel pollution. Diesel pollution can cause health problems such as asthma or other breathing problems, heart attacks, strokes, cancer, and premature death.

The Diesel Program works directly with private and public organizations to seek grant funding for projects that reduce diesel pollution from their operations. Diesel-focused grants typically reimburse equipment owners **25–60% of the cost** to replace older diesel vehicles or diesel engines with cleaner equipment.

## TYPES OF PROJECTS WE'VE PREVIOUSLY RECEIVED FUNDING FOR

- Replacing diesel yard trucks with all-electric yard trucks

**Partners:** Albertsons, BNSF Railway, King County, McLane Co, Seattle Public Utilities

- Replacing diesel ground support with equipment all-electric ground support equipment

**Partners:** United Airlines

- Replacing diesel marine engines with newer, cleaner engines

**Partners:** American Construction, Argosy Cruises, Crowley, Island Tug & Barge, King County

## EXAMPLES OF ELIGIBLE VEHICLES OR EQUIPMENT THAT CREATE DIESEL POLLUTION

- **On-road:** heavy-duty trucks, buses, waste haulers, and emergency-response vehicles
- **Off-road:** construction equipment, aircraft-support equipment, yard trucks, and other cargo-handling equipment
- **Marine/Rail:** tugboats, work boats, ferries, government vessels, and locomotives

## PRIORITIES FOR THE TYPE OF VEHICLE OR EQUIPMENT TO BE REPLACED

- Large, old engines (preferably older than 2012)
- Used often (preferably daily)
- Operates in areas close to businesses or communities with high diesel pollution
- Vehicles such as yard trucks with high hours of operation and high idling times
